

## Enrique Breccia Oltre Ediz Illustrata

*Alberto Breccia is recognized as one of the greatest international cartoonists in the history of comics and Mort Cinder is considered one of his finest achievements. Created in collaboration with the Argentine writer Héctor Germán Oesterheld, best known in the U.S. for his politically incendiary sci-fi masterpiece, the Eisner Award-winning The Eternaut, Mort Cinder is a horror story with political overtones. This episodic serial, written and drawn between 1962–1964, is drawn by Breccia in moody chiaroscuro. The artist's rubbery, expressionistic faces capture every glint in the eyes of the grave robbers, sailors, and slaves that populate these stories; while the slash of stripes of prisoners' uniforms, the trapeziums of Babylon, and more create distinct and evocative milieus.*

*Alberto Breccia's Dracula is composed of a series of brutally funny satirical misadventures starring the hapless eponymous antihero. Literally defanged (a humiliating trip to the dentist doesn't help), the protagonist's glory days are long behind him and other, more sinister villains (a corrupt government, overtly backed by American imperialism) are sickening and draining the life out of the villagers far more than one creature of the night ever could. This is the first painted, full-color entry in Fantagraphics' artist-focused Alberto Breccia Library,*

*and the atmospheric palette adds mood and dimension. It also includes a sketchbook showing the artist's process.*<sup>[2]</sup>

E proprio la casa, ideata secondo un progetto architettonico spettacolare quanto imperscrutabile, frutto di un apprendistato sui generis che l'ha consacrato come maestro e capofila di un movimento rivoluzionario, sarà la chiave di accesso a un passato carico di esperienze traumatiche e dissidi esistenziali, pulsioni aberranti e scelte faticose che hanno compromesso il rapporto con i figli e con il mondo circostante, dal quale Hal si è appartato da tempo, prigioniero della torre d'avorio da lui stesso concepita.

In 1975 Nina Bunjevac's mother fled her marriage and her adopted country of Canada and took Nina back to Yugoslavia to live with her parents. Peter, her husband, was a fanatical Serbian nationalist who had been forced to leave his country at the end of World War II and migrate to Canada. But even there he

continued his activities, joining a terrorist group that planned to set off bombs at the homes of Tito sympathisers and at Yugoslav missions in Canada and the USA. Then in 1977, while his family were still in Yugoslavia, a telegram arrived to say that a bomb had gone off prematurely and Peter and two of his comrades had been killed. Nina Bunjevac tells her family's story in superb black-and-white artwork. *Fatherland* will be recognised as a masterpiece of non-fiction comics, worthy to stand beside *Persepolis* and *Palestine*.

A biography of the 15th century monarch, Alfonso V of Aragon. Based on extensive archival research, it covers political and cultural developments during his reign, as well as providing details of his childhood and of his role as a warrior.

In this graphic novel, presented in English for the first time, the Italian "Crumb" portrays a lost generation of late 1970s/early 1980s teenagers coping with family problems, school, sex, and drugs. A true visionary, with a fluid line and an uncanny sense of color and composition, Paziienza's innovative graphic style served up stories that were iconoclastic, outrageous, humorous, and deeply personal, often based on himself and his microcosm of friends and collaborators. Paziienza was a revolutionary cartoonist who ushered an underground sensibility to Italian and European comics, breaking from the more staid tradition of genteel adult (and children's) graphic albums.

Nessun altro paese europeo, salvo Spagna e Portogallo, può vantare un simile meccanismo di politica estera e per la prima volta viene raccontata la storia di questa esperienza unica nella politica estera italiana, con dovizia di dettagli e fornendo informazioni inedite. In un mondo sempre più complesso, dove Stati Uniti e Cina si fronteggiano ormai direttamente, coltivare e rafforzare il rapporto italo (euro) latinoamericano dovrebbe essere una priorità strategica per una media potenza, come è l'Italia, e per una Unione europea alla ricerca del proprio «Estremo Occidente». *This is a psychedelically drawn, boldly political retelling of the 1950s graphic novel *The Eternaut*, whose imagery is still used as a symbol of resistance in Latin America to this day. The 1950s version of *The Eternaut*, a seminal Argentine work, is drawn in F. Solano Lopez's clean, orderly comics art style. In the 1969 reboot, the darker tone is reflected in Breccia's Expressionist art. In *The Eternaut 1969*, the great world powers have forsaken South America to*

*alien invaders, and POV character Juan Salvo, along with his friend Professor Favalli, metalworker Franco, and neighbor Susanna, join the resistance in Buenos Aires with the knowledge that the outside world will not come to their aid. Through the lenses of these timeless characters, the politically prescient creators ask readers to consider the implications of global domination by the "great powers" before it's too late.*

Nel febbraio del 2000 usciva in edicola il centosessantunesimo albo di Dylan Dog. Lo disegnava Nicola Mari,

per la prima volta alle prese con uno stile grafico che sarebbe rapidamente evoluto nel segno per il quale ora il disegnatore ferrarese è famoso in tutto il mondo. Quello che nessuno sapeva per ò era che Mari aveva disegnato le prime ottanta tavole della storia di Tiziano Sclavi in uno stile completamente diverso, cos ì tetro, cos ì crepuscolare, cos ì materico e sporco da indurre lo stesso artista a chiedere di poter ricominciare, per timore di non essere capito dai lettori. Ora BAO Publishing ripubblica la versione ufficiale della storia, con una copertina inedita di Nicola Mari e una ricca sezione in appendice con la comparazione tra le vignette che furono originariamente stampate e quelle mai viste, direttamente dagli archivi della Bonelli e dell'artista stesso. Un codice QR in fondo al volume permette di scaricare tutte le pagine della versione scartata accanto alla sceneggiatura di Sclavi, per un'affascinante lettura parallela del testo originale e della prima interpretazione grafica che ne fu data. Imperdibile.
