E se prima dominavano incomprensione e disinteresse per i rispettivi sentimenti, con il tempo Jing-mei comprenderà l'amore della madre Suyuan che la spronava sempre alla perseveranza, all'ottimismo, a dare il massimo per avere il meglio, proprio per evitare alla figlia le tragedie che a lei erano toccate in passato, quando si trovava ancora in Cina..

Der Fremdwortpurismus war das dominante sprachpolitische Thema während der faschistischen Regierungszeit in Italien. Die Frage nach den Folgen des Versuchs, tausende Fremdwörter in der italienischen Sprache zu ersetzen, entzog sich bislang einem fundierten Urteil, da es an diachronisch-vergleichenden Datenerhebungen mit onomasiologischem Ansatz mangelte. Die vorliegende Arbeit untersucht die lexikalische Substitution von Fremdwörtern theoretisch und empirisch. Am Beispiel entlehnter Sportterminologien (u.a. Radsport, Fußball, Boxen, Tennis) und mithilfe einer Korpusanalyse im Archiv der Tageszeitung «La Stampa» wird aufgedeckt, welche Ausdrucksvarianten für über 100 Sport- und Freizeitkonzepte zwischen 1920 und 1970 im Sprachgebrauch konkurrierten, aufgegeben oder beibehalten wurden. Auf dieser Grundlage werden Muster lexikalischen Wandels und Einflussfaktoren der Substitution identifiziert. Zudem wird der faschistische Fremdwortpurismus anhand einer eingehenden Quellenanalyse neu periodisiert und eingeordnet. Die Studie beleuchtet mit sprachtheoretischen sowie sach- und sprachhistorischen Zugängen eine Schlüsselperiode der italienischen Sprachgeschichte, um Fremdwortgebrauch und -kritik auch im Italienisch der Gegenwart zu verstehen. And he explains why existing U.S. policies hamper North-South reconciliation and reunification. Assessing North Korean capabilities and the motivations that have led to its forward deployments, he spells out the arms control concessions by North Korea, South Korea, and the United States necessary to ease the dangers of confrontation, centering on reciprocal U.S. force redeployments and U.S. withdrawals in return for North Korean pullbacks from the thirty-eighth parallel. Similarly, he proposes specific trade-offs to forestall the North's development of nuclear weapons and missile delivery systems, calling for the withdrawal of the U.S. nuclear umbrella in conjunction with agreements to denuclearize Korea embracing China, Russia, and Japan. The long-term goal of U.S. policy, he argues, should be the full disengagement of U.S. combat forces from Korea as part of regional agreements insulating the peninsula from all foreign conventional and nuclear forces. A veteran journalist with decades of extensive firsthand knowledge of North Korea and long-standing contacts with leaders in Washington, Seoul, and Pyongyang, Harrison is perfectly placed to make these arguments. Throughout, he supports his analysis with revealing accounts of conversations with North Korean, South Korean, and U.S. leaders over thirty-five years.
