Professors fall into three stereotypes: the vehicle to explain facts, the baffled genius, and the evil madman. By the late twentieth century, the stereotype of the male, mad, muddlehead, called Professor SomethingDumb, is formed in humorous yet pejorative fashion. This Element provides a publishing history of the role of academics in children's literature, questioning the book culture which promotes the enforcement of stereotypes regarding intellectual expertise in children's media. This title is also available, with additional material, as Open Access.

In her new edition of this popular book, Cathy Nutbrown presents evidence of continuity and progression in young children's thinking. Supported with detailed observation, that they are able and active learners.
