

## A Lie Of The Mind A Play In Three Acts

If you died alone, would anyone find you? When investigative Journalist Andrea Kellner finds the body of a woman propped up in a chair in the basement of an abandoned home, she has no idea how the discovery will change her world. Who is the woman? How did she die? And why was her body left undiscovered for so long? A small wrist tattoo reveals the dead woman as someone close to those Andrea loves. But is the young woman’s drug history an explanation for her death or a clue to something far more sinister? And can Andrea uncover the truth before others suffer the same fate?

When friends Rob, Liam, Mia, and Galen gather for a weekend of fun deep in the forest, one is hiding a lie and not everyone will live to find out which one it is.

In eighteen stories unlike any in our contemporary literature, Sam Shepard explores the vast and rugged American West with the same parched intensity that has made him “the great playwright of his generation” (The New York Times). A boy watches a “remedy man” tame a wild stallion, a contest that mirrors his own struggle with his father. A woman driving her mother’s ashes across the country has a strangely transcendent run-in with an injured hawk. Two aging widowers, in Stetsons and bolo ties, together make a daily pilgrimage to the local Denny’s, only to be divided by the attentions of their favorite waitress. Peering unblinkingly into the chasms that separate fathers and sons, husbands and wives, friends and strangers, these powerful tales bear the unmistakable signature of an American master.

We are all taught, early in life, that it is bad to lie. But nobody warns us that some people will ignore this rule—to their benefit, and our detriment. While most of us live by the same moral code, we aren't armed with the tools to deal with the liars who do not. Rather, our brains are hardwired to make it more likely we will believe liars, and fall prey to manipulators. A truth bias makes our brains default to believing everything we hear as true; a trust bias makes our brains default to trusting people; and an authority bias makes our brains more likely to trust people in positions of power, even if we have information that contradicts what that powerful person is saying. Jake und Beth haben geheiratet und sind zusammengezogen. „A lie of the mind“ zeigt den Tiefpunkt dieser Ehe. Jake hat seine Frau Beth geschlagen! – tot geschlagen? Eifersucht und Raserei- Einbildung, nicht Beweise trieben ihn zu der Gewalttat, die den Ausgangspunkt für die Dramenhandlung bildet. Die geschundenen Kinder werden nach Hause geholt. Nun eröffnen sich Bilder, Hintergründe und Vergangenheit der Liebenden und ihrer Familien.
