He argues for mixed-use cities, of [architectural speech] rather than [architectural stutter], and pointedly plots the man-vehicle-landneed ratio of [sub-urban man] versus that of a city dweller. In an age of energy crisis, he writes (and his drawings show), we [build in the wrong places, in the wrong patterns,
