his children's verse, especially "Little Boy Blue" and

"Wynken, Blynken, and Nod." During his journalistic

career, however, his column, "Sharps and Flats," in the

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Chicago Daily News illuminated the shenanigans of local and national politics, captured the excitement of baseball, and praised the cultural scene of Chicago and the West over that of the East Coast and Europe. He argues that the acquisition process is determined by a variety of factors: the frequency of the various complex sentences in the ambient language, the semantic and syntactic complexity of the emerging constructions, the communicative functions of complex sentences, and the social-cognitive development of the

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child.
