Kids' drawings are often a representation of how they perceive and see objects and people. Helping them express themselves improves their self-esteem. And it creates a positive impact on a kid's relationships with peers, parents, and neighbors. Develops fine motor skills :- Drawing helps children develop fine motor skills by improving their hand-eye coordination. The more they practice to draw lines and figures, the faster they can improve their coloring and handwriting skills. Helping and encouraging kids to draw, from an early age will help them fine-tune their finger muscles and improve hand-eye coordination. Boosts memory :- A study by researchers at the University of Waterloo found that drawing pictures is a stronger and more reliable strategy to improve memory. Drawing pictures of any information enable kids to remember it longer than writing or crafting mental images, and observing pictures of the objects depicted by the words. Develops problem-solving skills :- Doodling is the artistic process that enhances problem-solving skills in children. To draw lines on paper and associate them with colors and figures kids learn to imagine different solutions and perceive problem-solving from different perspectives. Drawing mind maps to

recollect and remember what is learned is one of the most effective ways to demonstrate an understanding of any topic. When kids create a mind map, they are able to collect and organize data to solve a given problem more effectively. Conclusions : Drawing is one of the most entertaining and relaxing activities for kids. Let children doodle freely and express themselves fearlessly. According to research students remember 45 percent of the information they draw, while only 20 percent of things they wrote. Using mind maps in studies can help in improving memory and academic performance. Doodling helps in boosting problem-solving skills. This groundbreaking work explores how children and adults who have been blind since birth can both perceive and draw pictures. John M. Kennedy, a perception psychologist, relates how pictures in raised form can be understood by the blind, and how untrained blind people can make recognizable sketches of objects, situations, and events using new methods for raised-line drawing. According to Kennedy, the ability to draw develops in blind people as it does in the sighted. His book gives detailed descriptions of his work with the blind, includes many pictures by blind children and adults, and provides a new theory of visual and tactile perception - applicable to both the blind and the sighted - to account for his startling findings. Kennedy argues that spatial perception is possible

through touch as well as through sight, and that aspects of perspective are found in pictures by the blind. He shows that blind people recognize when pictures of objects are drawn incorrectly. According to Kennedy, the incorrect features are often deliberate attempts to represent properties of objects that cannot be shown in a picture. These metaphors, as Kennedy describes them, can be interpreted by the blind and the sighted in the same way. Kennedy's findings are vitally important for studies in perceptual and cognitive psychology, the philosophy of representation, and education. His conclusions have practical significance as well, offering inspiration and guidelines for those who seek to engineer ways to allow blind and visually impaired people to gain access to information only available in graphs, figures, and pictures.

The Republic responded to this crisis by establishing *colonias infantiles* (children's colonies), often in country estates and mansions that had been abandoned by fascist sympathizers. In these colonies, the young refugees--many of them orphaned or sent by their parents to safety--received schooling and medical care, kept each other company, and produced thousands of drawings that serve as a moving, collective testimony of the experience of being a child in wartime. Born of the trauma of exile and separation, the drawings are invaluable historical documents, giving physical form to the children's experiences of air raids, brutality, destruction, and homelessness. These pictures also represent daily life in the colonies and preserve the children's clear memories of life before the war and hope for life after it. They are supplemented by a smaller selection of drawings from later wars, showing that this problem is contemporary as well as historical.
