Reduction for clarinet (or basset clarinet) and piano. The basset clarinet (with an extended range to low C) has been enjoying a resurgence in popularity. Many modern composers have been answering this trend by writing new music for the instrument. Joan Tower's Clarinet Concerto, while performable on the standard A clarinet, takes advantage of the basset clarinet's extended range with a few melodic excursions to notes beneath E. This 19-minute work was recorded on Summit Records pianist Eckhart Selheim.

As the first book of its kind, Nancy Lee Harper's Portuguese Piano Music: An Introduction and Annotated Bibliography fills the gap in the historical record of Portuguese piano music from its start in the 18th century to the present. While although Spanish piano music is well documented owing to the reputation of such composers as Isaac Albéniz, Enrique Granados, and Manuel de Falla, our knowledge of compositions in the tradition of Portuguese piano music has not fared as well, barring the work of Carlos Seixas (1704-1742). This obscurity, however, reflects poorly on the history of early piano music in light of the many compositions written for fortepiano on behalf of the Portuguese court during the first half of the 18th century. Indeed, it was in the royal halls of King John V during his reign from 1706 to 1750 where the early fortepiano was frequently heard. In Portuguese Piano Music, Harper explores this rich musical tradition, offering a brief introduction to the pianistic history of Portugal and overviews of Portugal's contributions to solo piano music, piano in instrumental chamber music, piano concerti, piano for multiple pianists including with works with electronics, and didactic piano. While paying close attention to female composers, Harper adds an annotated and graded bibliography that presents readers with a comprehensive inventory of compositions. Appendixes include a selected discography, list of publishers, and other types of critical source information. To further illustrate its contents, Portuguese Piano Music contains a CD on which Harper performs representative repertoire, some of which are world premieres. This work is aimed at pianists, teachers, pupils, musicologists, and music lovers seeking to discover the remarkable world of Portuguese piano music.

Piano reductions of orchestral scores are invaluable tools for rehearsals and arguably the most frequent vehicles for modern-day performances. Piano accompanists face the arduous task of performing an orchestral reduction in a manner consistent with the integrity of the score while achieving an idiomatic sound on the keyboard. All pianists stand to gain from any study that offers practical approaches to and considerations for arriving at a sensible pianistic representation of any work originally intended for orchestra. This study uses Mozart's Clarinet Concerto, K. 622, to examine the most accessible editions arranged for clarinet and piano. It highlights the differences between all of the orchestral reductions and evaluates these choices from a pianist's perspective. Furthermore, the work includes numerous side-by-side comparisons, assesses each edition in terms of its adherence to the orchestral score, and offers multiple interpretations of the most effective way to represent the orchestra within the confines of the piano.

One of the most important composers for the clarinet as it began to develop as a concert instrument, Carl Stamitz composed 11 clarinet concertos, inspired by the playing of the virtuoso Joseph Beer. The popular Third Concerto was composed around 1785 and is one of the finest examples of classical writing for the instrument. This classic Edition Peters publication contains a separate clarinet part and piano reduction, and matches the Peters orchestral material for the work.
