Louisa May Alcott (1832–1888) published more than thirty books in her lifetime, but it was her "girls' story" (written at the request of her publisher), *Little Women*, that has captured the imagination of millions of readers. This coming-of-age story spotlights beloved tomboy Jo March (arguably America's first juvenile heroine and a reflection of a young Alcott herself) and Jo's three sisters—Meg, Beth, and Amy—in a heartwarming family drama. Originally published in two parts, in 1868 and 1869, *Little Women* has never been out of print.
