Although plans for rapidly delivering MCM to a large number of people following an anthrax attack have been greatly

enhanced during the last decade, many public health authorities and policy experts fear that the nation's current systems and plans are insufficient to respond to the most challenging scenarios, such as a very large-scale anthrax attack.
