It was around this the time that milk cartons began to feature the images of missing children, and newscasters began asking, “ It ’ s 10:00, do you know where you children are? ” Alligator Candy chronicles Jon ’ s story, but also tells how parenting in America has changed, casting light on the transition between two generations of children—one raised on freedom, the other on fear. “ Parents today can understand the love, hope, and fear Kushner so eloquently describes in this account of one family ’ s transcendent courage in the face of crushing pain ” (Bookpage, “ Top Ten Book of the Month ”).
