Abstract: The ability to read underpins all other learning structures. Instruction in this essential element begins in the pre-school and primary grades.

Therefore, many assume that junior

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high school students already possess foundational reading proficiencies, but the number of adolescents experiencing literacy struggle has proven that assumption to be wrong. This self-study examines the reading curriculum, for it is the main

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medium utilized in the classroom to develop reading abilities.

Curriculum should be evaluated not only for its effectiveness (Tyler, 1949), but also for its side effects (Schwab, 1983). One side effect of curriculum could be struggling

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readers. The research is organized through various frameworks. The theoretical underpinnings for the study are derived from Dewey's (1938) theory of experience and Rosenblatt's (1978, 2004) transactional theory. This eclectic

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approach to theory (Schwab, 1971) provides the conceptual frame to examine curriculum not just as-planned but as-lived. Schwab's (1973) four commonplaces: subject matter, learner, milieu, and teacher also form important curricular

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considerations for curriculum making. These commonplaces help to sort out desiderata essential for fruitful curriculum making (Connelly & Clandinin, 1988). Self-study as a research genre and narrative inquiry as a methodology

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provide the other impetus that guide the study for the curriculum journey with junior high school striving readers. All of this is accomplished through embracing the image of teacher as curriculum maker as opposed to the dominant image of

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teacher as curriculum implementer.

This is an essential book for everyone who wants to write clearly about any subject and use writing as a means of learning.
