**Pieter Bruegel the Elder (1525/30-1569) was a remarkable draftsman and designer of prints as well as a great painter. **This Brief concerns the influence of chemistry in the modern food and beverages industry. The world of traditional foods has been soundlessly but increasingly interconnected with the chemical industry in the last century. Different areas are considered in a multidisciplinary approach: - the production of chemical additives and of non-food components needed in the food industry (e.g. packaging materials) - the regulatory perspective of the whole food production chain - commercialization of food commodities - the problem of food safety from the viewpoint of official auditors with medical or veterinarian competencies - new and emerging risks related to food packaging materials - the assessment of the authenticity of edible products. This Brief includes different viewpoints, ranging from the management of allergens and food additives in the food plant to the complex matter of the formulation of traditional products with the consequent production of "alternative" versions of the same food.**

The essays assembled here represent forty years of reflection about the European cultural past by an eminent historian. The volume concentrates on the Renaissance and Reformation, while providing a lens through which to view problems of perennial interest. A Usable Past is a book of unusual scope, touching on such topics as political thought and historiography, metaphysical and practical conceptions of order, the relevance of Renaissance humanism to Protestant thought, the secularization of European culture, the contributions of

particular professional groups to European civilization, and the teaching of history. The essays in *A Usable Past* are unified by a set of common concerns. William Bouwsma has always resisted the pretensions to science that have shaped much recent historical scholarship and made the work of historians increasingly specialized and inaccessible to lay readers. Following Friedrich Nietzsche, he argues that since history is a kind of public utility, historical research should contribute to the self-understanding of society.

*Law, Person, and Community: Theological, Philosophical and Comparative Perspectives on Canon Law* explores the understanding of the human person that underpins canon law. From theological, philosophical, and comparative perspectives, the book poses the question: "What is law?" The book presents canon law as a classical legal system in which the positive law is derived from natural and divine law. The classical approach to law rests upon an understanding of human nature in which reason is able to know first principles and universal goods. The book indicates that the classical understanding contrasts with the modern positivistic theory of law in which the parameters of human reason are limited by the need for empirical verification. In the classical approach, law also reflects the supernatural destiny of the human person. This supernatural end leads to the priority of the contemplative over the political in the design of positive law. In comparison, liberal theory favors a political conception of justice and the human person. Although the classical approach to law recognizes universal norms, it remains open to the historically contingent. As illustrative of its historical development, canon law affirms the right of religious freedom on the basis of the traditional Western doctrines of the dignity of the human person and the

separation of church and state. Religious freedom is understood not only as the freedom of individual belief but freedom for the religious community to prosper through the practice of its faith in the pluralistic society. The book suggests that the classical approach to law with its ground in natural and supernatural truth affords a more firm foundation for the development of human rights than does the modern positivistic theory of law. The book further describes the classical role of law in setting the optimal conditions for human flourishing through membership, participation, and solidarity in community. Canon law fulfills this function for the religious community of the Catholic Church. The book juxtaposes canon law's view of religious freedom with that of the modern secular state in which religious freedom has been reduced to a matter of private belief. Employing the example of United States constitutional law, the book describes how the modern secular state has curtailed the function of law in fostering the freedom of the religious community in the public order. The book observes that the modern view is at odds with religious traditions such as Judaism, Catholicism, and Islam in which the practice of faith depends on the proper relation between law, person, and community. The book thus proffers that canon law serve as a dialog partner in the broader discussion about what is law."

*Stefania Tutino shows that post-Reformation Catholic culture was a rich laboratory for our current moral and hermeneutical anxieties. This book provides a selection of papers of the late Daniel Amit (1938–2007). Daniel Amit was a physicist who spent the last 22 years of his life working on neural network models. He was one of the pioneers in the field. The volume contains 21 papers, from the highly influential 1985 paper on the Hopfield model (published together with Hanoch Gutfreund and Haim Sompolinsky), to his last (unpublished) manuscript. Many of these papers are landmark papers in the field. The book also provides a biography; an introduction on Daniel Amit's scientific career before the Hopfield model; and introductions to each of the included papers, written by their co-authors. This book will be of interest to physicists, computational neuroscientists and neurobiologists.*

*The need for a "new" book on Greek colonization arose to analyse this phenomenon as a long-term process in a wide geographic area. The events related to individual cities and regions, although geographically very distant from each other, are linked through an articulated network of material and immaterial relations and have to be considered as part of a broader mobility process in a Mediterranean perspective. The intention of "Comparing Greek Colonies" is to bring*

*geographically and culturally distant regions such as Southern Italy/Sicily and the Black Sea, closer together, not merely to find "similarities and differences", but to broaden the scholars' perspective and overcome existing, generalizing, and biased models, that are often rooted in local scientific traditions. The proceedings of the international conference "Comparing Greek Colonies. Mobility and Settlement Consolidation from Southern Italy to the Black Sea (8th- 6th century BC)", 7.-9.11.2018 in Rome, are structured around three core topics (economic system; relationships with the indigenous populations; social and territorial systems) that constitute the cornerstones of the political formation of the polis in the Archaic period and for its development during the Classical and Hellenistic Ages.*
