But all is not lost. Ariely also identifies what keeps us honest, pointing the way for achieving higher ethics in our everyday lives. With compelling personal and academic findings, *The (Honest) Truth About Dishonesty* will change the way we see ourselves, our actions, and others.

Tulisa Contostavlos is one of the most talented and high-profile recording artists working in the UK today.
