Arthur Machen is best known for his influential supernatural, fantasy, and horror fiction. Machen was a great enthusiast for literature that expressed the "rapture, beauty, adoration, wonder, awe, mystery, sense of the unknown, desire for the unknown" that he summed up in the word *ecstasy*.
