Partisan warfare and gridlock in Washington threaten to squander America's opportunity to show the world that democracy serious economic problems and ensure widely shared prosperity. Instead of working together to meet the challenges ahead—work force, exploding inequality, climate change, rising debt—our elected leaders are sabotaging our economic future by blaming and demonizing each other in hopes of winning big in the next election.
