As Joy closes in on Florida, she must confront her own damaged memory and the secrets she has been keeping from herself.

A foreign policy that is agile and flexible is also necessary—and for that, Danon says preparation and readiness are requisite. Showing and sharing your strengths is a far-reaching way to secure the nation, and Israel 's advancements in medicine, technology, and cutting edge scientific research position it to do so. Finally, Israel must always commit itself to fighting the scourge of anti-Semitism across the globe.
