As makers, we tend to learn different stitches over time without thinking much about how they relate to one another. But when Natalie Chanin and her Alabama Chanin and The School of Making teams began to look at needlework closely, they realized all stitches are based on geometric grid systems—and by using grids as guides, they could make learning stitches, even seemingly elaborate ones, as easy as child’s play. In The Geometry of Hand-Sewing Chanin presents their breakthrough method, featuring illustrated instructions (for both right- and left-handed stitchers) for more than 100 stitches—from the most basic straight and chain to the more fanciful feather and herringbone; photos of both right and wrong sides; and guidelines for modifying stitches to increase one’s repertoire further. To simplify learning, the book also offers downloads for two stitching cards with the grids on which every stitch in the book is based. These printable cards can be used as stencils for transferring grids to fabric. In Where’s Stitch: When You Feel Like You’ve Lost Your Best Furry Friend, Mark Gregston helps children grieving the loss of a beloved pet and reminds them that even after our pets pass away, they live forever in our hearts. Have you ever lost a beloved pet? Do you ever wonder where they go once they pass away? Stitch loved to run and play and was always up for adventure. Mamaw, Poppa, and all the children would often ask, “Where’s Stitch?” Sometimes she could be found swimming in the pond with the horses, sitting by the fire with Mamaw, or taking a nap on the porch. But then Stitch grew older and became sick. When she passes away, the children wonder where she went. Mamaw and Poppa try to explain. While some people say dogs cross the rainbow bridge or go to doggie heaven, they reassure the children that no matter where Stitch has gone, she left them with memories they will never forget and taught them to be kind, to play, and to always love others. Mark Gregston’s Where’s Stitch? is a beautiful reminder that even after we lose our best furry friends, they live forever in our hearts.
