Of course, we have to go very far and we have not made any beginning yet. However, at present, the advaitic principle of differences Brahman can serve the purpose of harmonizing all religions. Here we have adopted this principle. Secondly, the key concepts of different religions have been shown to mingle with one another.

Based on the close reading of previously unexplored print and manuscript sources in Arabic, Persian, and Urdu spanning the late eighteenth century to the entirety of the nineteenth century, this book intervenes in and integrates the often-disparate fields of religious studies, Islamic studies, Asian studies, critical secularism studies, and political theology.

Who is Allah? What does He ask of those who submit to His teachings? Pulitzer Prize-winner Jack Miles gives us a deeply probing, revealing portrait of the world's second largest, fastest-growing and perhaps most tragically misunderstood religion.
