Although the current evidence base for the effects of psychosocial interventions is sizable, subsequent steps in the process of bringing a psychosocial intervention into routine clinical care are less well defined. Psychosocial Interventions for Mental and Substance Use Disorders details the reasons for the gap between what is known to be effective and current practice and offers recommendations for how best to address this gap by applying a framework that can be used to establish standards for psychosocial interventions. The recommendations also target providers,*

*professional societies, funding agencies, consumers, and researchers, all of whom have a stake in ensuring that evidence-based, high-quality care is provided to individuals receiving mental health and substance use services.*

In the United States, some populations suffer from far greater disparities in health than others. Those disparities are not only by fundamental differences in health status across segments of the population, but also because of inequity factors that impact health status, so-called determinants of health. Only part of an individual's health status depends on her behavior and choice; community-wide problems like poverty, unemployment, poor education, inadequate housing, lack of public transportation, interpersonal violence, and decaying neighborhoods also contribute to health inequities, as well as the historic and ongoing interplay of structures, policies, and norms that shape lives. When these factors are not optimized for a community, it does not mean they are intractable: such inequities can be mitigated by social policies that can shape communities in powerful ways. *Communities in Action: Pathways to Health Equity* seeks to delineate the causes of and the solutions to health inequities in the United States. This report focuses on what communities can do to promote health equity, what actions are needed by the many and varied stakeholders that are part of communities or support them, as well as the root causes and structural barriers that need to be overcome.

Cancer care today often provides state-of-the-science biomedical treatment, but fails to address the psychological and (psychosocial) problems associated with the illness. This failure can compromise the effectiveness of health care and adversely affect the health of cancer patients. Psychological and social problems created or exacerbated by cancer include depression and other emotional problems; lack of information or skills needed to manage the illness; lack of transportation and other resources; and disruptions in work, school, and family life--cause additional suffering, weaken adherence to prescribed treatments, and threaten patients' return to health. Today, it is not possible to deliver high-quality cancer care with existing approaches, tools, and resources to address patients' psychosocial health needs. All patients with cancer and their families should expect and receive cancer care that ensures the provision of appropriate psychosocial health services. *Care for the Whole Patient* recommends actions that oncology providers, health policy makers, educators, health insurance health planners, researchers and research sponsors, and consumer advocates should undertake to ensure that this goal is met.
