This report examines the use and perceived value of minority-targeted scholarships by undergraduate, graduate, and professional schools. It found that minority-targeted scholarships accounted for a small proportion of total scholarships and scholarship dollars in academic year 1991-92. However, race or ethnicity was rarely the sole criterion; most minority-targeted scholarships used additional criteria, such as financial need or academic merit, for awarding funds.
