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*First published in 1998, Reproducing Narrative sets out to interrogate a number of medico-legal reproductive discourses. Recognizing that these dialogues are heavily imprecated in broader social, political and economic discourses it is contended that responses to reproductive issues are influenced and possibly determined, by non-reproductive concerns both at a parochial and more general level. Whilst a number of such influential narratives are recognized the book concentrates on the narratives of gender which appear implicit within the discourses and practices considered. Given the productive nature of discourse and the traditional premising of gender on sexual difference it becomes apparent that the explicit figuring of the female reproductive body becomes a means of realizing the implicit gender narratives within these discourses. Privileged medico-legal discourses become understood as a technology of gender - an important site at which gender is constituted.*

This work deals with the continuing debate between doctors, lawyers and medical ethicists regarding the provision of modern health care. It offers a wide-ranging treatment of medical law and examines the many ethical issues which beset medicine today. This new edition has been revised and expanded to reflect current debates, including an increase in the coverage of the treatment of transsexualism, additional material on the criminal responsibility of doctors and coverage of persistent vegetative state cases. Written in a clear, concise style, the book offers a broad overview of medical law and its interaction with medical ethics. Mason looks at the legal response to those aspects of the troubled pregnancy which require or involve medico-legal intervention. The unwanted pregnancy is considered particularly in the light of the Abortion Act 1967, s.1(1)(d) and the related action for so-called wrongful birth due to faulty ante-natal care. The unexpected or uncovenanted birth of a healthy child resulting from failed sterilisation is approached through an analysis of the seminal case of McFarlane and associated cases involving disability in either the neonate or the mother. The disabled neonate's right to sue for its diminished life is discussed and the legal approach to the management of severe congenital disease is analysed - thus following Baroness Hale in believing that care of the newborn is an integral part of pregnancy. Aspects are considered from historical and comparative perspectives, including coverage of experience in the USA, the Commonwealth and Europe.

Excerpt from Syphilis in Its Medical, Medico-Legal and Sociological Aspects Contagious diseases, as a menace to the individual by their method of spreading, and as a menace to the race by their transmitted hereditary taint, offer an interesting field of study to the physician. The physician, more than anyone else, must try to prevent their spreading, and must enlighten the people concerning their existence and their consequences, so that the necessary precautions may be taken to protect society. Syphilis, as an infectious and contagious disease, which is communicated to the healthy by inoculation, and is transmitted by heredity to the fetus, either kills the fetus in utero, or causes the child to come into the world a tainted creature, demands our attention as a subject for study of deepest interest. The connection between syphilis and social relations is so little understood that the name of the disease alone is sufficient to cast a mark of dishonor on the man who has had the misfortune to be inoculated. The public in general, ignorant of causation, is unable to understand the difference between one innocently infected and one who exposes himself to infection through lack of morality. Indeed, we shall never expect to be understood by superstitious people who, with religious devotion, carry about a potato in their hip pocket, which they believe will absorb all their rheumatic humors, or by those who carry pieces of carbon left by the arc lights for the same superstitious purpose. Neither do we expect to be understood by those who, on account of their belief in occult virtues, wear an iron ring on their little finger, which they claim to be electric and able to cure them of all their rheumatic pains which may be the result of a gouty condition, or perhaps of an old neglected syphilis. Whoever entertains such irrational views and such disproportionate hopes, is superstitious and incapable of realizing that when a man has an eruption on his face, although it may be of a syphilitic nature, the fault of the infection does not necessarily rest on the lack of morality of the person. A great many, ignorant of the manifestations of any disease of the skin, are likely to think any eruption on the face or on the hands the result of syphilis. It is for this reason we have decided to publish a few sociological considerations on this dreadful disease, for the purpose of placing the man who is infected with syphilis in a true social light. *Published in 1998, this work is concerned, in the main, with reproduction - for which marriage is not an essential prerequisite. Nevertheless, much of sexuality and the greater part of parenthood still subsist within the marital relationship. Sex and marriage are interdependent - indeed the definition of the latter depends on the former. After looking at the prerequisites for marriage and for making a marriage void, the author shows that the medico-legal interests of marriage relate to the mental health and the sex of the parties. The author also looks at various aspects of the sexual-familial relationship, including contraception, sterilization, abortion, protection of the foetus, foetal experimentation, the infertile husband, the infertile woman, defective neonates and infants, consent to treatment and research in children, the protection of young children and the killing of children within the family. Cases are used to highlight the legal aspects of these subjects.*

*Those involved in family and sexual relationships today face a bewildering variety of medico-legal dilemmas. These are encountered from as early as the preconception state of the embryo and continue throughout the period of child raising until the status of the mature minor is achieved. This book dissects a wide range of legal, medical and ethical issues surrounding reproduction and the parental relationship with the resultant child. Questions posed in the various sections include: what constitutes sexual intercourse, what are the implications of contraception and sterilization, is the abortion issues dead?. Is there a right to reproduce and, if so, how is this applied to the modern methods of assisted reproduction?. Is surrogate motherhood acceptable or workable?. The concept of fetal rights is explored and specific attention is given to the management of defective neonates in the light of recent judicial decisions. Other chapters look at the parent/child relationship in respect of medical treatment and the book concludes with a review of the interfamilial protection of young children under both the civil and the criminal law. Many of the views expressed are novel in that they represent those of a medical doctor exploring the legal field. It is neither a conventional book on family law nor one on medical law; rather, it draws on both to examine a specific area which affects both in a particularly significant way. Both statute and case law have been extensively updated since the publication of the first edition.*
