The Oldest Living Things in the World is an epic journey through time and space. In the past decade, artist Rachel Sussman has researched, worked with biologists, traveled the world to photograph continuously living organisms that are 2,000 years and older. Spanning from Antarctica to Greenland, the Mojave Desert to the Australian Outback, the result is a stunning and unique visual collection of ancient organisms, anything that has been created in the arts or sciences before, insightfully and artfully narrated by Sussman along the way. Sussman has journeyed to Antarctica to photograph 5,500-year-old moss; Australia for stromatolite primeval organisms tied to the oxygenation of the planet and the beginnings of Earth; and to Tasmania to capture a 43,600-year-old self-propagating shrub that

last individual of its kind. Her portraits reveal the living history of our planet—and we stand to lose in the future. These ancient survivors have weathered millennia of the world's most extreme environments, yet climate change and human encroachment have put many of them in danger. Two of her subjects have already met with untimely deaths by human hands. Alongside the photographs, Sussman relays fascinating and sometimes harrowing – tales of her global adventures tracking down her subjects and shares insights from the scientists who research them. The oldest living things on earth are a record and celebration of the past, a call to action in the present, and a barometer of our future.

Tudor Parfitt examines a myth which is based on one of the world's oldest mysteries - what happened to the lost tribes of Israel? Christians and Jews alike have attached great importance to the legendary fate of these tribes which has had a remarkable impact on their ideologies throughout history. hearsay. The belief persisted that they had been lost in some remote part of the world and there were countless suggestions and claims as to where.

The long-awaited memoir of a trailblazer and role model who is telling her story for the first time. Since retiring from the Air Force and NASA, she has served on numerous corporate boards and is an inspirational speaker about space exploration and leadership. Eileen Collins is among the most recognized and admired women in the world, yet this is the first time she has told her story in a book. It is a story not only of achievement and overcoming obstacles but of profound personal transformation. The shy, quiet child of an alcoholic father and struggling single mother, who grew up in modest circumstances and was an unremarkable student, she had few prospects when she graduated from high school, but she changed her life to pursue her secret dream of becoming an astronaut. She shares her leadership and life lessons throughout the book with the aim of inspiring and passing on her legacy to a new generation.
