Brent to be pigeonholed Brent's perfection as the dissipated Englishman in *The Rains Came* (1939) and surprise turn as the heavy in *Staircase* (1946) fueled the longevity of his career. The personal life of George Brent remained undercover. Upon signing with MGM, the studio publicity fabricated a back-story for Brent: a graduate of Dublin University (he dropped out of school at 16); a player in the Theatre (for which no record exists); a dead mother (who was very much alive); and, a dispatcher for Michael Collins during the Irish Revolution (this . . . was true). Brent's biography offers a fascinating look into the life of Hollywood's elusive lone wolf. Scott Brown's biography on Ruth Chatterton made *The Huffington Post's* "Best Film Books of 2013," abetted by Irish filmmaker Brian Reddin. *George Brent: Ireland's Gift to Hollywood and Its Leading Ladies* (Foreword by Wesleyan University's Chair of Film Studies, James Basinger.) 331 pages with 125 illustrations capture the glamour and private world of Hollywood's Golden Age.

Exploring how neoliberalism has discovered the productive force of the psyche Byung-Chul Han, a star of German philosophy, offers a passionate critique of neoliberalism, trenchantly describing a regime of technological domination that, in contrast to Foucault's work, discovered the productive force of the psyche. In the course of discussing all the facets of neoliberal psychopolitics fueling our current crisis of freedom, Han elaborates an analytical framework that provides an original theory of Big Data and a lucid phenomenology of the self. But this provocative essay proposes counter models too, presenting a wealth of ideas and surprising alternatives at every turn.

**BILLIONAIRE ROMANCE** Anna McCallister loves her billionaire real estate tycoon boss, Henry Reid, with all her heart. She loves his kindness, his innovation, his endless optimism, and his sense of humor. Not to mention the fantasies she has about him day and night. But shy, gentle Anna wouldn't dream of approaching him with her desires. She has convinced herself that he could never be interested in her, but takes every opportunity she can to be with him. On Christmas Eve, she gladly goes with him on a visit to a Catskills farmhouse that his company just completed rebuilding. There, they plan to tour the place, finish up with the construction team, and have a nice dinner with one of Henry's friends. Henry left off dating a few years ago after a horrible breakup led to his being stalked by his ex. He claims to be "picky", leaving Anna to feel that she has no chance. But when Henry's dour but attractive foreman, James Thompson, flirts with Anna openly in front of him, Henry reacts with obvious jealousy. Unfortunately this leads to his ignoring James when the man tries to warn him that a powerful snowstorm is bearing down on them. Later that night, before the pair can leave, the snowstorm hits, trapping them inside the farmhouse with only a few supplies. They have two days before they run out of the means to heat the farmhouse in the freezing weather. In the deepening cold, they share a bed for warmth...and Anna's longing catches fire when she finds herself in Henry's sleepy embrace.

Spanning eight decades and chronicling the wild ride of a Greek-American family through the vicissitudes of the twentieth century, Jeffrey Eugenides' witty, exuberant novel on one level tells a traditional story about three generations of a fantastic, absurd, lovable immigrant family -- blessed and cursed with generous doses of tragedy and high comedy. But there's a provocative twist. Cal, the narrator -- also Callie -- is a hermaphrodite. And the explanation for this takes us spooling back in time, through a breathtaking review of the twentieth century, to 1922, when the Turks sacked Smyrna and Callie's grandparents fled for their lives. Back to a tiny village in Asia Minor where two lovers, and one rare genetic mutation, set our narrator's life in motion. *Middlesex* is a grand, utterly original fable of crossed bloodlines, the intricacies of gender, and the deep, untidy promptings of desire. It's a brilliant exploration of divided people, divided families, divided cities and nations -- the connected halves that make up ourselves and our world.
