Teaching approaches for pupils with learning difficulties have often emphasized the presentation and repetition of easily manageable tasks rather than exploration, learning through mistakes and reflection. However, there is encouraging evidence that such pupils may be helped to develop effective learning approaches with marked improvements in their academic performance and self-concept. The importance of the teacher's role in facilitating pupils' reflective activity cannot be overstated. The American-born Louise de Bernard despised Major Heinz Minden—and her husband even more for collaborating with the Germans when their tanks first rumbled through their centuries-old village. Into this seething hotbed of betrayal

and brutality, Roger Savage arrives. The undercover Allied agent recruits Louise to help him destroy a lethal nerve gas the Germans are secretly manufacturing nearby. But now a high-ranking Nazi general is dead, and an entire village is about to be punished in the most merciless and horrifying way. Culminating in post-war Germany as an SS officer prepares to stand trial for wartime atrocities, *Stranger at the Gates* is a spine-tingling page-turner about family and sacrifice, loyalty and love, and how ordinary people can become heroes.

In the last 25 years of his life his explorations increased—especially in shorter forms—plays—as Williams created performance pieces with elements of theater of the absurd, theater of cruelty, theater of the grotesque, as well as motifs from Japanese forms such as Noh and Kabuki, high camp and satire, and with innovative visual and verbal elements that were entirely his own. Influenced by Beckett, Genet, and Pinter, among others, Williams worked hard to expand the boundaries of lyric realism he was best known for. These plays were explicitly intended to be performed off-off Broadway or regionally. Disturbing, sometimes outrageous, quite often the tone of these plays is rough, bawdy or even cartoonish. While a number of these plays employ what could be termed bizarre "happy endings," others gaze unblinkingly into the darkness. Though several lesser-known works from this period have already been published by New Directions, these twelve plays have never before. Most of these shorter plays are unknown to audiences and scholars—some are published here for the first time—yet they all embrace, in one way or another, what Time magazine called "the four major concerns that have spurred Williams' drama."
