

## *Resumen De Pedro Paramo*

En una de las ediciones criticas mas importantes de la obra de Rulfo; Claude Fell, coordinador, y un sustancial equipo de investigadores sobre el escritor jalisciense, presentan las dos obras basicas, Pedro Paramo y El llano en llamas, ademas de relatos y textos autobiograficos, textos para cine, ensayos, discursos y entrevistas. Uno de los principales objetivos de esta edicion es comparar los manuscritos de Rulfo con las distintas ediciones de sus textos para estudiar las modificaciones que el autor hizo a traves de los anos. Aparecen compilados una serie de articulos, resenas y ensayos sobre la obra rulfiana; una cronologia de la vida y obra del escritor y su contexto historico, y la que es quiza la bibliografia mas completa.

Este análisis de las imágenes en la obra Pedro Paramo de Juan Rulfo se enfocó desde las categorías expuestas por Luis Alfonso Ramírez Peña: texto, discurso, modalizaciones y representaciones. Las imágenes son un medio usado en el proceso de formación académica, asimismo contribuye a aumentar la capacidad de aprendizaje del estudiante. En este caso se ha elegido la obra de Juan Rulfo, Pedro Páramo, porque en ésta se evidencia el uso constante de las imágenes como recurso literario para representar una época de la historia de México. De igual modo, vale tener en cuenta que a pesar de la época que fue escrita esta obra aún sigue vigente... Resumen: El siguiente trabajo plantea el análisis que cumple la mujer y su rol en la obra Pedro Páramo del escritor mexicano Juan Rulfo publicado en el año de 1955. Pedro Páramo es una novela donde el personaje central es el pueblo de Comala, un pueblo muerto donde no viven más que ánimas. La historia comienza con el viaje que Juan Preciado realiza a Comala en busca de su padre Pedro Páramo para ajustar cuentas. Dr. Zanardi approaches the development of psychoanalytic theories of women on two fronts: the psychoanalytic and the political. theoretical and clinical points of view. The second part draws attention to the influence of the Women's Liberation Movement on psychoanalytic theory. The papers included show attempts to integrate psychoanalysis into the ideological political discourse. It includes the work of leading feminists and psychoanalysts in the United States and Europe, including Carol Gilligan, Dorothy Dinnerstein, Jean Baker Miller, Juliet Mitchell, Luce Irigaray, and Julia Kristeva.

Juan Rulfo is one of the most important writers of twentieth-century Mexico, though he wrote only two books—the novel *Pedro Páramo* (1955) and the short story collection *El llano en llamas* (1953). First translated into English in 1967 as *The Burning Plain*, these starkly realistic stories create a psychologically acute portrait of poverty and dignity in the countryside at a time when Mexico was undergoing rapid industrialization following the upheavals of the Revolution. According to Ilan Stavans, the stories' "depth seems almost inexhaustible: with a few strokes, Rulfo creates a complex human landscape defined by desolation. These stories are lessons in morality. . . . They are also astonishing examples of artistic distillation." To introduce a new generation of readers to Rulfo's unsurpassable literary talents, this new translation repositions the collection as a classic of world literature. Working from the definitive Spanish edition of *El llano en llamas* established by the *Fundación Juan Rulfo*, Ilan Stavans and co-translator Harold Augenbrom present fresh translations of the original fifteen stories, as well as two more stories that have not appeared in English before—"The Legacy of Matilde Arcángel" and "The Day of the Collapse." The translators have artfully preserved the author's "peasantisms," in appreciation of the distinctive voices of his characters. Such careful, elegiac rendering of the stories perfectly suits Rulfo's Mexico, in which people on the edge of despair nonetheless retain a sense of self, of integrity that will not be taken away. La ficción de la memoria es una antología que recoge investigaciones, ensayos, testimonios y entrevistas sobre la obra literaria de Juan Rulfo. El orden de su secuencia es cronológico porque quiere hacer ver cuál ha sido la evolución crítica a lo largo de los años, desde los primeros trabajos de Carlos Blanco Aguinaga (1955), Mariana Frenk (1961), hasta los de Juan Villoro (2000) y Jorge Aguilar Mora (2001): las diferentes lecturas de una generación a otra. Asimismo los testimonios se presentan -de Gabriel García Márquez (1980) y Jorge Luis Borges (1985) a Juan José Arreola (1994) y Jorge Volpi (2000)- según se fueron dando en el tiempo a partir del momento en que aparecieron *El llano en llamas*, en 1953, y *Pedro Páramo*, la única, magistral novela de Rulfo, que vio la luz de la imprenta el 27 de marzo de 1955. Podemos apreciar, por ejemplo, en la obra de "Pedro Páramo", el tratamiento de la mujer, la violencia, el dialecto regional, el hermoso ambiente geográfico, y la gran metáfora universal de la Revolución mexicana. Juan Rulfo quiere proyectarnos dentro de este lindo cuento los rasgos típicos de la cultura mexicana Una forma interpretativa de "Pedro Páramo" es de ver la obra como una crónica distante de la Revolución mexicana. Esto se nota en cinco categorías principales: 1) el tratamiento de la mujer, 2) la violencia, 3) el dialecto regional, 4) el ambiente geográfico y 5) la metáfora universal de la Revolución mexicana. Si se observa el tratamiento de la mujer en la obra, se nota que las mujeres sufrieron mucho durante la Revolución mexicana. Los hombres no las respetaban y las trataban como "cosas". Encima las abusaban, como por ejemplo Miguel Páramo a Ana: "Solamente le sentí encima de mí y que comenzaba a hacer cosas malas conmigo." (pag. 89). Y las mujeres se callaban y aguantaban este tratamiento. "Y yo le sonreí. Pensé en lo que usted me había enseñado: que nunca hay que odiar a nadie."

(pag. 88). En este mundo patriarcal, los hombres pudieron legalmente tener tantos hijos bastardos con ellas como querían, porque pudieron imponer derechos feudales a los cuerpos de las mujeres que vivían en sus tierras.

In 2015 she was invited by the British Council to be the first ever International Writer in Residence at Hay Festival in Wales, and in the same year she was named as one of the most outstanding young writers in Mexico as part of the project México20. Umami is her first novel. She lives in Cologne, Germany. Sophie Hughes is a literary translator and editor living in Mexico City. Her translations have appeared in Asymptote, PEN Atlas, and the White Review and her reviews in the Times Literary Supplement and Literary Review.***

La primera reacción instintiva de muchas personas confrontadas con un caso de incesto probablemente es el asco. Hay una gran variedad de estereotipos frente al incesto, como veremos mas adelante. Es objeto de observaciones psicoanalíticas, sociológicas, criminológicas, biológicas etc. En este trabajo quiero enfocarme en los aspectos psicoanalíticos y sociológicos. El incesto es un tema importante en "Pedro Páramo". Encontramos un caso claro de incesto hermano-hermana (los hermanos incestuosos) y un caso probable de incesto padre-hija (Bartolomé San Juan y Susana San Juan). Merece la pena una investigación porque es un tema muy tocado en la literatura latinoamericana; "amasterplot of the Spanish American novel involves the brother-sister incest motif". La meta de este trabajo es explicar porqué el incesto forma parte de la narración. ¿Qué quiere lograr Juan Rulfo? ¿Tiene valor simbólico o es una provocación al lector? ¿Es sustancial la tesis de que el incesto en la literatura es una manifestación de deseos inconscientes fuertes del autor? Comala, el sitio de la acción, se asimila a un infierno dantesco en pequeña escala. La historia está contada por varios narradores, entre ellos algunos que narran desde sus tumbas. Además del incesto la trama está llena de violencia y concupiscencia. Rulfo lo presenta empleando varias técnicas como el flujo de conciencia, flashbacks, y narradores múltiples cuyas voces fácilmente se pueden confundir. La confusión del lector me parece el rasgo más importante y bien intencionado de la obra. Debido a la gran cantidad de literatura sobre el incesto y a la limitación prescrita de diez páginas el trabajo presentado no puede profundizar en el tema.**

*Andrew Dempsey spent a decade to study the photographic collection of Juan Rulfo, composed of about 6,000 images. A joined work and both Daniele De Luigi selected 100 of them. This book is the first catalog of the knowledge of the entire file of Juan Rulfo and meets most of the genres he cultivated, properly weighted: the buildings of Mexico, the many landscapes of the country, the life of small towns, artists, writers, friends and family of Juan Rulfo. It includes two texts by Juan Rulfo: one dedicated to Henri Cartier-Bresson in the two periods of its passage through Mexico and the other on the Mexican photographer Nacho Lopez. The authors also write about the selection of Juan Rulfo's photography from a very knowledgeable in their respective areas of competence.*

*Après une introduction générale qui indique les grands courants de la littérature ibéro-américaine, on aborde l'étude des littératures de tous les pays d'Europe et d'Amérique de langues espagnole et portugaise. Pour chaque pays, on trouve une introduction, des*

*textes choisis et une bibliographie. Cet ouvrage (1) est le résultat d'un travail d'équipe auquel ont participé des universitaires, des critiques et des écrivains français et ibéro-américains. Ce manuel répond à un besoin croissant de connaître et d'étudier la littérature ibéro-américaine de notre temps. Il est destiné aux élèves de classes terminales des lycées et aux étudiants d'université. Il comporte une Introduction Générale qui indique les grands courants de la littérature ibéro-américaine, et une présentation des littératures de tous les pays d'Europe et d'Amérique de langues espagnole et portugaise. Il fait une place à des littératures habituellement ignorées, comme celles d'Amérique Centrale ou des Caraïbes. Pour chaque pays, quelques pages d'introduction ont pour tâche d'expliquer les liens entre l'histoire contemporaine et la création littéraire. A la suite de ces pages d'introduction, les étudiants et les professeurs trouveront pour chaque pays une bibliographie sommaire et un certain nombre de textes choisis. Chaque texte est précédé d'un bref commentaire permettant de le situer dans l'œuvre de l'auteur. Le critère qui a présidé au choix est avant tout le caractère actuel de l'oeuvre : roman, poésie, conte, et éventuellement, selon le pays, théâtre et essai. On n'a pas oublié les jeunes écrivains de la nouvelle génération qui font une entrée en force dans les lettres ibéro-américaines. En somme, ce manuel constitue une tentative d'appréhension de l'ensemble ibéro-américain à travers son expression littéraire. L'étude de ces littératures devrait nous amener à mieux cerner le problème suivant : qu'est-ce que le monde ibéro-américain ? (1) Ecrit en espagnol ou en portugais selon le pays étudié.*
