Romans 1:16 The book of Romans was written by the apostle Paul in A.D. 56-57, while Paul was in Corinth. It was probably written during Paul's third missionary journey right before he

was planning to return to Jerusalem. His plans were to go to Rome on his way to Spain, so he writes this letter with those intentions in mind. The letter is addressed to the Christian converts living in Rome and although there was a Christian church in Rome at the time, it had not been officially founded by Paul. Most likely, the church had been started by other missionaries and consisted of both Jewish and Gentile converts. The message in the book of Romans has awed and astonished people throughout history. Scholars and commentators have marveled at the spiritual depths of the gospel message presented in the letter by Paul. Martin Luther's world as he knew it changed after he studied the book of Romans. The Protestant Reformation erupted once the teachings on the book of Romans were made available to the public. Lives were changed with a message of hope, justification and righteousness, not of works, but of grace. One major theme is repeatedly made clear throughout this letter: there is no Christianity without Jesus Christ. He is the Center. He is the answer. He is the One who came to save. To believe in Him and to place our faith in Him are the keys to our freedom from sin and its bondage.

Aaron Ricker locates the purpose of Romans in its function as a tool of community identity definition. Ricker employs a comparative analysis of the ways in which community identity definition is performed in first-century association culture, including several ancient network letters comparable to Romans. Ricker's examination of the community advice found in Rom 12-15 reveals in this new context an ancient example of the ways in which an inscribed addressee community can be invited in a letter to see and comport itself as a "proper" association network community. The ideal community addressed in the letter to the Romans is defined properly unified and orderly, as well accommodating to – and clearly distinct from cultures "outside." Finally, it is defined as linked to a proper network with recognised leadership (i.e., the inscribed Paul of the letter and his network). Paul's letter to the Romans is in many ways a baffling and extraordinary document. In terms of its community-defining functions and strategies, however, Ricker shows its purpose to be perfectly clear and understandable.

Paul's letter to the Romans, says Nanos, is an example of Jewish correspondence addressing believers in Jesus who are steeped in Jewish ways—whether of Jewish or gentile origin. Arguing against those who think Paul was an apostate from Judaism, Nanos maintains Paul's continuity with his Jewish heritage. Several key arguments here are: Those addressed in Paul's letter were still an integral part of the Roman synagogue communities. The "weak" are non-Christian Jews, while the "strong" included both Jewish and gentile converts to belief in Jesus. Paul as a practicing devout Jew insists on the rules of behavior for "the righteous gentiles." Christian subordination to authorities (Romans 13:1-7) is intended to enforce submission to the leaders of the synagogues, not Roman government officials. Paul behaves in a way
