

Section 3 Guided Global Security Issues

This book offers an analysis of the threats facing the UK and its policy responses, presented under the framework of the Government's National Security Strategy. It contains opinions from leading figures across relevant agencies, including the National Security Council and members of ACPO, as well as case studies.

This 2005 book discusses the legitimacy of the international criminal law regime. It examines the development of the system of international criminal law enforcement in historical context from antiquity through the Nuremberg and Tokyo Trials, to modern-day prosecutions of atrocities in the former Yugoslavia, Rwanda and Sierra Leone. The modern regime of prosecution of international crimes is evaluated with regard to international relations theory. The book subjects that regime to critique on the basis of legitimacy and the rule of law, in particular selective enforcement, not only in relation to who is prosecuted, but also the definitions of crimes and principles of liability used when people are prosecuted. It concludes that although selective enforcement is not as powerful as a critique of international criminal law as it has been previously, the creation of the International Criminal Court may also have narrowed the substantive rules of international criminal law.

NGOs and middle-power countries can team up to create solutions to international security problems like child soldiers and landmine proliferation.

This edition of the U. S. Army War College Guide to National Security Policy and Strategy

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continues to reflect the structure and approach of the core national security strategy curriculum at the War College. The fourth edition is published in two volumes that correspond roughly to the Department of National Security and Strategy's core courses: "Theory of Strategy" and "National Security Policy and Strategy." Like previous editions, this one is an expansion of its predecessor rather than a major rewriting. About a quarter of the text are new, and several others have undergone significant rewrites or updates. However, approximately half of the book remains unchanged. Although this is not primarily a textbook, it does reflect both the method and manner we use to teach strategy formulation to American future senior leaders. The book is not a comprehensive or exhaustive treatment of either strategic theory or the policymaking process. Both volumes are organized to proceed from general to the specific. Thus the first volume opens with general thoughts on the nature of the theory of war and strategy, proceeds to look at the complex aspect of power, and concludes with specific theoretical issues. Similarly, the second volume begins by examining the policymaking process, moves to a look at the strategic environment, and concludes with some specific case studies. This edition adds several short case studies that can be used to illustrate the primary concepts of the volume.

Through deep archival research, Chayes reveals that canonical political thinkers such as John Locke and Machiavelli, as well as the great medieval Islamic statesman Nizam al-Mulk, all named corruption as a threat to the realm. In a thrilling argument connecting the Protestant Reformation to the Arab Spring, Thieves of State presents a powerful new way to understand global extremism. And it makes

a compelling case that we must confront corruption, for it is a cause—not a result—of global instability.
