This fresh approach to spiritual growth explains the biblical reasons why Christians need to undergo change in six aspects of life: thought, feeling, will, body, social context, and soul. Willard also outlines transformation in each area, not as a sterile formula but as a practical process that you can follow without the guilt or perfectionism so many Christians wrestle with. Don't settle for complacency. Accept the challenge. Renovation of the Heart offers to become an intentional apprentice of Jesus Christ, changing daily as you walk with Him.

In Catching the Wind of the Spirit, Rev. "The Holy Spirit is much the same as the wind and the sailboat," says Rev. Sunder Krishnan. It is the vital work of transforming each of us into the image of our Savior and Lord. But in order to be effectively steered and directed by the Spirit, we must embrace the spiritual disciplines that will help us gradually and progressively be transformed into the image of Christ.
