Abstract: This paper describes an advocacy project using the Six-Trait analytical writing and assessment model developed by the Northwest Regional Educational Laboratory (NWRLE). The six-trait model suggests effective writing requires proficiency in the following traits: Ideas, Organization, Conventions, Voice, Sentence Fluency, and Word Choice. To improve student writing, the model was used in a classroom setting when utilized for instruction as well as assessment. To assess a student's writing proficiency level, each trait is scored using a six-trait rubric. The goal of this project is to encourage all Algoma School District teachers at all grade levels, regardless of subject area, to implement six-traits in their classes. Utilizing the six-trait model is especially beneficial when student drafts, revising, editing, and assessing.
