Lewis Carroll Born Charles Lutwidge Dodgson. (1832 - 1898) A famous English writer, mathematician, logician, and photographer. Carroll's most famous writings are *Alice's Adventures in Wonderland*, its sequel *Through the Looking-Glass*, which includes the poem "Jabberwocky", and the poem *The Hunting of the Snark*, all examples of the genre of literary nonsense. He is noted for his facility at word play, logic, and fantasy. *Alice's Adventures in Wonderland*, first published in 1865, tells of a girl named Alice falling through a rabbit hole into a fantasy world populated by peculiar, anthropomorphic creatures. The tale plays with logic, giving the story lasting popularity with adults as well as with children.
