You will need: Worsted or Aran yarn (up to 100 grams), knitting needles to obtain the gauge (this pattern's gauge is 19 sts in 4in/10cm in stockinette stitch), darning needle to weave in the yarn ends and to sew the crotch. One button, a stitch marker, scrap yarn or stitch holders. The romper is knit in the round.

The modular domino

Most of the projects are made with wool yarn knitted at a slightly looser gauge than recommended by the manufacturer so that the finished piece can be felted in the washing machine, creating unique and contemporary looks.

The Kingdom of Happiness is the story of one man's quest to create his own nirvana in the desert based on his exacting design and experimentation with lessons he's gleaned not only from the incredible success of Zappos, but also from rave culture and Burning Man. Make the cutest baby rompers using this knitting pattern! The pattern comes in newborn, 3-6 months and 6-12 months sizes. The newborn size is meant to fit the baby for the first two weeks. It makes a great coming home from the hospital outfit, and it also is the size that is preferred by

newborn photographers. You will need up to 70 grams (for newborn size) / up to 150 grams (for the 6-12m size) of Aran yarn in the main color and a small amount of yarn in contrast color. This romper is knit in the round. You will need either double pointed needles or a circular needle to knit in the round (if you are using Magic Loop). You will also need a tapestry needle to weave in the yarn ends and to do the grafting. You will need one stitch marker, one button and a matching thread to sew on a button, one stitch holder. This pattern's gauge is 18 stitches in 10cm/4in in stockinette stitch.
