Make sure that you are strapped in good for the roller coaster ride of your life to a world of the bizarre. As your tour guide, the narrator, Moe Sr., bares his naked soul; raw and uncut, as his faith, will, and values are tested at every turn as he navigates his way through the maze we call, life. In this spellbinder, which is laced with satire and suspense, he addresses the subject of the dysfunctional family. This book is crammed with drama; his relationship with Vera and her family; with his first wife, Thelma; his struggles as a single parent; arresting his own demons; and his liberation from a grave of death and ignorance. This book is a story of devotion and deceit, suicide, alcoholism, the occult, murder for hire, and incarceration and redemption. Furthermore, this book is a story of love and hatred, of the unloved who betray those whom they pretend to love, confession and forgiveness, and eventually, overcoming the odds. On the cover, he is draped in the American flag that is fashioned in a straightjacket. This symbolism, he states, is not a condemnation of America, but a stark reminder to her of her own dysfunctional behavior, past and present, and to also remind her that the people are the physicians ( “ We the People ” ), forever prescribing the Constitution as a prescription for healing. Finally, this book is a testament to the spirit of the human condition and the power of change. “ Cogito Ergo Sum! ” / “ I think. Therefore I must exist! ” -Descartes.

Jeffery collides with thoughts of giant robots holding girls out castle windows when he awakes in a mental institution and can't remember how he got there. Strange things like being wrapped in a straight jacket and locked in a padded cell with a skeleton that stole his leg begin to surround him. He starts to wonder what goes on inside a straight jacket while being worn by someone, the kind of instruments that need to be taught science fiction lessons. Meanwhile, he is confronted by a sadistic guard named Tommy Bluesneakers and decides that he must escape. Accompanied by his new friends, the neighboring patients Street doctor =smile, Children8, and Flower, Jeffery sets out into the hidden tunnels beneath the institute while slowly starting to lose his mind. Then someone shouts, "Move over sailor!" I can't really describe it.

Universally acknowledged as the father of capitalism, the eighteenth-century Scottish thinker Adam Smith is best known for his “ invisible hand ” theory. This theory argued in favor of setting individuals free to pursue their self-interests for the good of all and has helped to make Smith's name synonymous with unfettered free market capitalism. In this book, Jonathan Conlin rescues Smith from the straight-jacket of economics, reattaching the “ invisible hand ” to Smith ’ s philosophy of ethics. As Conlin shows, Smith rooted our instincts to trade in human psychology. Analyzing the contrasts he saw between the industrializing Scottish lowlands and the clan-based pastoralism of the Scottish highlands—as well as the contrasts between the ideas of contemporary thinkers such as Jean-Jacques Rousseau and David Hume—Smith advanced a system of ethics founded on sympathy. Weaving

together Smith ' s life and ideas, Conlin shows how the latter anticipated much more recent developments surrounding behavioral economics, virtue ethics, and social inequality. Ultimately, Conlin argues, Adam Smith offers us a set of tools to face today's challenges and become better and happier human beings.
