By incorporating the divine names and titles into their prayers - and learning about the biblical context in which the name was revealed - readers will gain a more intimate understanding of who God is and how he can be relied on in every circumstance of their lives. God makes many promises to his people in the pages of Scripture, and one of the most powerful testimonies to his faithfulness in keeping those promises are the names he gives himself or those his people bestow upon him. In this pocket-sized book, the Hebrew transliterations of the many names of God have been highlighted in the biblical text, offering readers a portable reminder of God's promises of protection, salvation, and guidance. Organized by the names of God and by topic for easy reference.

The Prophet Isaiah's words inspire us with their beautiful cadences and lofty heights. They confront us with thoughtful rebukes and correction. Isaiah is the source of nearly one quarter of the Old Testament quotations and allusions cited in the New Testament. In sheer size, it is second only to the Book of Psalms in length. Most important, Isaiah gives us a unique understanding of Jesus the Messiah, who fulfills many of these prophecies given 700 years before his birth. For this reason Isaiah is sometimes called the "Fifth Gospel." Isaiah considered one of the literary gems of the ancient world. Here is the apex of Hebrew poetic style, brilliant imagery, and the whole range of human emotion. Some of the passages you may recall include: "Though your sins are like scarlet, they shall be as white as snow" (1:18) "Here I am, send me." (6:1-8) "Unto us a child is born..." (9:2-7) "The wolf will live with the lamb, ... and a little child shall lead them." (11:1-9) "And a highway will be there; it will be called the Way of Holiness." (35:1-10) "Comfort, comfort my people..." (40:1-31) "They that wait upon the Lord shall renew their strength" (40:31) "The Lord has laid on him the iniquity of us all." (52:13-53:12) "Come, all you who are thirsty..." (55:1-12) "The Spirit of the Lord is upon me..." (61:1-11) Isaiah is challenging and enriching, but also long and complex. Therefore, this volume is designed to be a guide to studying Isaiah's prophecies, not a verse-by-verse commentary. We'll move quickly over passages less relevant to our day, but focus in some detail on passages that teach about the Messiah and God's universal truths that speak to us across the ages. This volume covers Isaiah eleven lessons, and includes 13 maps to clarify the historical setting. Classes and small groups will find this a helpful curriculum guide, with links to free participant handouts, as well as thorough preparation for the leader.

Thought-provoking questions will stimulate many profound discussions -- though groups may want to follow a 17-week track to thoroughly discuss these truths. The heavily-footnoted lessons provide most of the research that preachers and teachers will need for their task. At the same time, the lessons inspire and

challenge the individual reader to grow as a disciple of Christ.

Why is there so much confusion about the name of God? What is the true name of God anyway and does it matter to address God by that name? I choose to stick with what the scriptures say and use terms like God, Creator, Most High, Heavenly Father. confusion arises when people teach doctrines outside of what the scriptures speak as rendered in english alphabetical characters is YHWH (He is or I Am ALL Self Existent or Eternal). This name was replaced by the word LORD in our english translations. (see Strong's #3068) The four hebrew characters that make up the name is known as the Tetragrammaton which is Greek meaning "four letters." The four Hebrew charaers the Most High cannot be disputed. The dispute comes with the pronunciation of the name. With this, many spell the name as they pronounce it. From YHWH various pronunciations have developed like YahWaH (Yaw-ha-wa), Yahweh (ya-way), Yahuwah (Ya-hoo-wa) and this is where the conflict arises. Lets go to the scriptures to get an unbi together understood how the name was to be rendered into English. Ex. 6:3 And I appeared unto Abraham, unto Isaac, and unto Jacob, by the name of God Almighty, but by my name JEHOVAH was I not known to them. We must understand that the letter J did not come to exist in the alphabet until after the King James bible was completed. The letter J within words. Instead the letter I is used seeing there was no J used at the time of the translation. Knowing this is important because the names Jehovah, Jesus, Joshua etc... would not be found spelled in such a fashion that uses the letter J. Therefore Jehovah could not be a name of the Most High used among the Israelites. But "Y" character and the letter "V" replaced the hebrew "W." Now we can get a better understanding of how the name Jehovah was misrendered in english. In the hebrew alphabet there is no letter or character J. E. O. V. U. F therefore to correctly render "Jehovah" in english, it would be Yahawah or Yahuwah. (Some believe the "HA" character Hu (hoo) than the sharp sounding "HA" therefore they spell it Ya-Hu-Wah but the hebrew name of the Most High is YHWH the four hebrew characters nonetheless. Lets examine the Israelite historian Flavious Josephus' account of the name. Works of Josephus- Wars of he Jews, Book 5, Par 7 "A mitre also of fine linen encompassed his head and was another golden crown, in which was engraven the sacred name [of God]: it consists of four vowels. The four vowels mentioned are the four hebrew characters (hebrew vowels) that make up the name of YHWH that was engraved within the Levite Priest's mitre or turban. Ex 39:30-31 The name YHWH appears all throughout scripture supposed to keep the true name YHWH from being polluted or blasphemed) and was revealed to Moses after the Israelites left Egypt. Lets read again Ex. 6:3 And I appeared unto Abraham, unto Isaac, and unto Jacob, by the name of God Almighty, but by my name JEHOVAH (YHWH) was I not known to them. The Most High clearly states the Almighty" (al shadday) and not by his name YHWH, but they still feared and worshipped the Most High. This shows that if the Most High demands we address him by his name YHWH only would he not have revealed this to Abraham the Father of the covenant? Lets also examine Ex. 2:23 ¶ And it came to pass in process of time, that the LORD saw the affliction of Israel, and he said unto God, because of the bondage, and they cried, and their cry came up unto God by reason of the bondage.

It is our sin that separates us from God and from fulfilling our deepest needs and longings. Sin is an offense against God that carries a serious penalty. According to Romans 6:23, "The wages of sin is death [eternal separation from the love and mercy of God]." Abandon Your Efforts. Second, you must abandon any efforts to save yourself. If we could save ourselves, Jesus' death would have been unnecessary! Even "getting religion" cannot get you to heaven. The Bible says it is "not by works of righteousness which we have done, but according to His [God's] mercy He saved us" (Titus 3:5). Salvation is by God's grace, "not of works, lest any man should boast" (Ephesians 2:8-9). Acknowledge Christ's Payment. What you cannot do for yourself, Jesus Christ has done for you! "But God commendeth His love toward us, in that, while we were yet sinners, Christ died for us" (Romans 5:8). He died on the cross for us, and then rose from the dead to prove that His payment was acceptable to God. But you must acknowledge and believe this fact. "Believe on the Lord Jesus Christ, and thou shalt be saved" (Acts 16:31). Accept Christ as Your Savior. Salvation is God's gift to you. "The gift of God is eternal life through Jesus Christ our Lord" (Romans 6:23). When someone offers you a priceless gift, the wisest thing you can do is accept it! In Old Testament times a name was more than simply nomenclature. It was, rather, a replica and revelation of the individual or thing itself. The study examines 11 names of God. The words translated as name show up over one thousand times in Scripture and routinely carry with them power, responsibility, purpose, and authority. A name not only expresses the essence and significance of what is being named but also—when duly authorized—accesses the capacity intrinsic within it. Because of God's depth of character, He has a variety of names to reflect His different capacities of relating to humanity.
