This magnificent tome is a previously unseen look behind-the-scenes at the making of this most legendary of science fiction classics. Art director Harry Lange's strikingly realistic designs for Stanley Kubrick's *2001: A Space Odyssey* created an extraordinary vision of the future and they remain the epitome of filmmaking. This graphic novel is necessary reading for our time. Alternately hopeful and heartbreaking, Hakim's *Odyssey* is a story about what it means to be human in a world that sometimes fails to be humane.
