I decided to assemble this compilation because of the numerous African American marriages that are working. Though books have been written about fathers and what they mean to daughters,

Unfortunately, we do not verbalize it enough. Some would prefer to continue to portray black men in general, and black husbands in particular as abusive, lazy, absent fathers, cheating husbands, and non-caring good-for-nothing men. However, I know that this is not true. I have been blessed to be married to my husband Kenneth Demire Gibbs Sr.—a strong example of black manhood—for 30 years. I will share our story with you later.
