Agatha Christie Classic In the Prologue, a man aboard the RMS Lusitania on 7 May 1915 quietly gives important papers to a young American woman, as she is more likely to survive the sinking ship. In 1919 London, demobilised soldier Tommy Beresford meets war volunteer Prudence "Tuppence" Cowley, both out of work and money. They form the "The Young Adventurers, Ltd", planning to hire themselves out with "[n]o unreasonable offer refused." They are overheard by Mr Whittington who follows Tuppence to offer her a position. He is shocked when she gives her name as "Jane Finn". Whittington sends her away with some money, then disappears without a trace. They advertise for information regarding Jane Finn. The advertisement yields two immediate replies. They first meet with Mr Carter, whom Tommy recognises as a leader in British intelligence from his war service. Mr Carter tells of Jane Finn aboard the RMS Lusitania when it sank in 1915. She received a secret treaty to deliver to the American embassy in London. She survived, but the government has found neither Jane Finn nor the draft treaty since. Publication of the treaty now would compromise the British government. Tommy and Tuppence agree to work for Carter. He warns them of the elusive and merciless figure known as Mr Brown. Next they meet with Julius Hersheimer, an American multimillionaire who is the first cousin of Jane Finn, staying at the Ritz Hotel. He is intent on finding her. He has already contacted Scotland Yard; an Inspector named Brown took his only photo of Jane, before a real inspector contacted him. Tommy and Tuppence join forces with Julius. Whittington mentions the name Rita to Tuppence. Tommy and Tuppence find her among the surviving passengers of the Lusitania, Mrs Marguerite Vandemeyer. Whittington and Boris Ivanovitch leave Rita's flat before Tommy and Tuppence have left the building. Tommy follows them, phoning Julius to aid him. Tommy follows Boris through London to a house in Soho, while Julius trails Whittington on the train to Bournemouth. Boris leads Tommy into a meeting of Bolshevik conspirators, where he is caught. Claiming he has knowledge regarding the missing treaty, he delays his execution. Tuppence secures the co-operation of Albert, the lift boy at Mrs Vandemeyer's residence, and obtains a job as Rita's maid. Tuppence hears Rita mention Mr Brown. The next visitor is Sir James Peel Edgerton, K.C.. On her afternoon off, Tuppence meets Julius at the Ritz. Julius had followed Whittington to a private nursing home, where Whittington met with a nurse. Before Julius could act, both Whittington and the nurse left. Tommy has not returned. Tuppence keeps Mr Carter informed. Tuppence persuades Julius to seek advice from Sir James. Tuppence returns early to the flat, where she interrupts her mistress's preparations to flee. After a tussle, Tuppence gains control of the gun, and Rita, who admits she knows who Mr Brown is. Upon the arrival of Julius and Sir James, Mrs Vandemeyer screams, collapses, and dies that night from poisoning. Before her death, she murmurs "Mr Brown" in Tuppence's ear. "The Secret Adversary" by Agatha Christie, is her second published work after "The Mysterious Affair at Styles" and like the later it first appeared as a series of seventeen episodes in "The Times" - weekly edition during August - December, 1921, followed by publication in the book format in 1922. In this novel, Agatha Christie introduced the readers to the adventurous pair of Tommy and Tuppence for the first time. We meet the pair in London of 1919 where jobs are scarce and living is difficult in the post-war aftermath. Prudence Cowley aka Tuppence and Tommy Beresford meet by chance and in their desperate attempt to earn money establish the "Young Adventurers Ltd." in a restaurant. But, as their luck would have it, Tuppence is asked to participate in an adventure by a man named Whittington as soon as she comes out of the restaurant. She goes to meet Whittington and scares him by giving her name as "Jane Finn" which results in ending the meeting abruptly. Together, Tommy and she decides to gather information about this "Jane Finn". In this quest, they meet two characters: one, a British intelligence man who calls himself Mr. Carter and tells them the story of Jane Finn. Jane Finn, on her journey from America to England, was charged with highly secretive and important documents by a man called Danvers on the ship Lusitania when the ship was torpedoed and sunk during the war. Danvers knew that as a woman, Jane's chances of survival were more than him and he was proved right as he was found dead later. The mystery is that this woman "Jane Finn" has disappeared since and so have the documents. They also meet Julius Hersheimer, Jane's cousin from America and together they all start working towards unfolding the mystery. The second link in the chain is Mrs. Marguerite Vandemeyer or "Rita" as she is widely known as. While trying to trace her, Tommy and Tuppence see Whittington once more. Tommy, while following Whittington, finds out a secret house where the current gang of supporters of soviet revolutionaries is working. They are seeking the documents carried by Jane Finn in order to unsettle the current government and bring the revolution. The leader of this gang is a man called Mr. Brown, whom nobody has ever seen. He is the secret adversary. Tommy is caught by these men and is kept as a prisoner in that house. Meanwhile, Tuppence gets a place as a housemaid in the home of Rita Vandemeyer and meets Sir James Peel Edgerton, K.C. who advises her to find a new

place. Worried by Tommy's disappearance, Tuppence goes to Sir Edgerton and tells him everything. When she goes back to Marguerite's house, she finds her all prepared to flee. She forces Tuppence to drink a sleeping draught on point of a revolver, but in a quick manœuvre, Tuppence gets hold of the revolver and offers her a bargain: A huge sum of money in lieu of information about Mr. Brown. But, at that moment Sir Edgerton and Julius arrives and Marguerite faints. She never wakes up. The doctor declares next morning that she died due to overdose of sleeping draught. After this death, Julius, Tuppence and Sir Edgerton go to meet Dr Hall who informs them that Jane Finn had been admitted to her nursing home after her arrival in England under the name of Janet Wandemeyer. The girl had completely lost her memory (like Bollywood) and was under her care for a long time but had been removed only recently. On coming back to the hotel, Tuppence receives a telegram signed by Tommy, and leaves to meet him. Meanwhile, Tommy manages to escape from his prison with the help of a French servant girl called Annette. Upon returning to the Ritz, Tommy and Julius recognize the telegram to Tuppence as a means of getting her out of the way. They retrieve the telegram, but fail to find any trace of her at the address given. While the boys are searching for Tuppence, they receive a message from Sir Edgerton that he has found Jane Finn and that she has gained her memory back.

With "The Secret Adversary", the famous English writer Agatha Christie introduces the detective couple Tommy and Tuppence to the reader. It was 2 p.m. on the afternoon of May 7, 1915. The Lusitania had been struck by two torpedoes in succession and was sinking rapidly, while the boats were being launched with all possible speed. The women and children were being lined up awaiting their turn. Some still clung desperately to husbands and fathers; others clutched their children closely to their breasts. One girl stood alone, slightly apart from the rest. She was quite young, not more than eighteen. She did not seem afraid, and her grave, steadfast eyes looked straight ahead. "I beg your pardon." A man's voice beside her made her start and turn. She had noticed the speaker more than once amongst the first-class passengers. There had been a hint of mystery about him which had appealed to her imagination. He spoke to no one. If anyone spoke to him he was quick to rebuff the overture. Also he had a nervous way of looking over his shoulder with a swift, suspicious glance. She noticed now that he was greatly agitated. There were beads of perspiration on his brow. The book introduces the characters of Tommy and Tuppence who are featured in three other Christie books and one collection of short stories written throughout her writing career. The New York Times Book Review of June 11, 1922 was also impressed, stating, "It is safe to assert that unless the reader peers into the last chapter or so of the tale, he will not know who this secret adversary is until the author chooses to reveal him." The review gave something of a backhanded compliment when it said that Christie "gives a sense of plausibility to the most preposterous situations and developments." Nevertheless they conceded that, "Miss Christie has a clever prattling style that shifts easily into amusing dialogue and so aids the pleasure of the reader as he tears along with Tommy and Tuppence on the trail of the mysterious Mr. Brown. Many of the situations are a bit moth-eaten from frequent usage by other writers, but at that Miss Christie manages to invest them with a new sense of individuality that renders them rather absorbing."

The book introduces the characters of Tommy and Tuppence who feature in three other Christie novels and one collection of short stories; the five Tommy and Tuppence books span Agatha Christie's writing career. The Great War is over, and jobs are scarce. Childhood friends Tommy Beresford and Prudence "Tuppence" Cowley meet and agree to start their own business as The Young Adventurers. They are hired for a job that leads them both to many dangerous situations, meeting allies as well, including an American millionaire in search of his cousin. Reviews were generally positive on this adventure, which manages to keep the identity of the arch-criminal secret to the very end.
