Technological advancements has led to development of innovative and effective reconnaissance and warfare gadgets and weaponry. This has also been motivated by increased terrorist activities across the globe in recent past. As a result, manned aerial vehicles and the current unmanned aerial vehicles(UAV's) have been established. Just like many other countries in the world, the United Arab Emirates (UAE) has embraced aerial reconnaissance in the light of security threats posed by rival nations and terrorist groups. It has had to think of strategies to protect itself and its citizens. Accordingly, the UAE has made considerable investments to expand its military capabilities. In 2013, the country signed defence contracts worth 1.4 billion U.S. dollars, a large portion meant for the delivery of predator drones by general Atomics. The UAE received them in 2017. However, the uncertainties surrounding the inclusion of aerial systems in military operations necessitate additional research on a range of wide areas, including their effectiveness against terrorism, and the legal and ethical issues that UAE and other nations may encounter in the process.

In the crowded and busy arena of obesity and fat studies, there is a lack of attention to the lived experiences of people, how and why they eat what they do, and how people in cross-cultural settings understand risk, health, and bodies. This volume addresses the lacuna by drawing on ethnographic methods and analytical emic explorations in order to consider the impact of cultural difference, embodiment, and local knowledge on understanding obesity. Ultimately, the goal of these guidelines is to help reduce levels of air pollutants in order to decrease the enormous health burden resulting from the exposure to air pollution worldwide.

While there are many books on knowledge management, knowledge governance is a concept that has not been so well explored, and is much less understood. Knowledge governance refers to choosing structures and mechanisms that can influence the processes of sharing and creating knowledge.The book argues that knowledge governance is a distinct issue in management and organization because knowledge processes differ on several dimensions from routine and more traditional processes. The relationship between governance issues and knowledge processes is under-researched, theoretically as well as empirically. Thematically, knowledge governance cuts across fields such as general management, human resource management, the management of intellectual capital, innovation theory, strategicmanagement, technology strategy, and international business. Not surprisingly, existing ideas are developed from the perspectives of different fields and from different underlying disciplinary foundations; however, it often remains unclear how these ideas relate together and how they differ in terms of unit of analysis, mode of analysis, underlying logic and assumptions, etc.This book is an important step towards overcoming the existing fragmentation in the field by providing a multi-disciplinary collection of chapters on knowledge governance. While the single chapters accentuate the pluralism in the field, they all examine issues that constitute the essence of knowledge governance.

Simply because politics is underinstitutionalized in such states does not mean that it is underdeveloped: the informal realm holds considerable political capital. As such, the book argues that it is important to use the links between the social (i.e. informal personal networks) and political (i.e. government institutions) to gain influence in policymaking in such states.Using contemporary history and original empirical research, Courtney Freer updates traditional rentier theory. Islam serves as a prominent voice and tool to promote more strictly political, and often populist or reformist, views supported by many Gulf citizens.
