

Training Manual For Associate Ministers

Identifying and equipping men for the role of church Elder is not an easy task...The role of Elder is perhaps one of the most important roles in the world, since the church is both the body and bride of Jesus. That means church leaders need more than surface opinions about the men who might possibly fit the role of Elder. They need a way to evaluate and train those candidates. This workbook-style handbook is designed to help church leaders do just that, in a wise, careful, and thoroughly Biblical way. Some contexts where this handbook may be helpful:

- When an existing Elder team needs to bring others onto their team
- When a Pastor needs to establish an Elder team from scratch
- When an Elder team needs a "refresher" about their role, or would like additional training regarding the Biblical mandate for Elders
- As a discipleship curriculum for men, where the role of Elder is held up as a "model" for how they can lead their families with the heart of a shepherd

This handbook is not offered as a magic formula or fool-proof method for finding or equipping men for the role of Elder. No such thing exists. Scripture clearly teaches that men are only appointed to the role of Elder by the determination of the Holy Spirit (Acts 20:28). Instead, this handbook is designed to serve as a tool in that Spirit-led process. It is an aid in discerning the will of the Spirit, first through assessment of the man being considered, and secondly through training for those who appear to be called to serve as Elders. With over 260 study questions, a variety of self-assessment tools, scripture memorization, and "quizzes" to test the candidate's understanding and application of the concepts included, The Elder Training Handbook is a serious-minded tool for discovering, encouraging, and equipping men to shepherd, protect, and lead the New Testament church.

Since the Associate most always has no official designation within the church, most don't know where they fit. At times, we have not known what to do with them. This manual is designed to help guide and develop the Associate to prepare for effective ministry and line up with the vision of the House.

The next generation of ministers, if they are to be more fully formed for ministry, depends on skilled mentoring alongside wise supervisors. A man who's been transformed by Christ and desires to preach the gospel might say he feels called to be a pastor. This personal conviction, while heartfelt, doesn't accomplish the important, challenging steps necessary to be a qualified leader. So where should full-time ministry begin? It will enable ministers and lay leaders to save time on research, organize their presentations, and provide internal and external ministry. The book also contains important information to handle internal church crises and external emergencies, press and media inquiries, and compliance with applicable governmental laws, rules, and regulations. Information to develop and utilize standard protocols for Church operations is also included. The manual covers many of the major ceremonies, rituals, and practices of the 21st-century Church. It addresses traditional and non-traditional issues faced by the modern Church, including, but not limited to, church administration, the work of twenty-first-century pastors and trustees, bi-vocational pastoring, rape trauma, suicide, substance abuse disorders, the prison-industrial complex, and so much more. In addition to providing guidance on non-traditional issues, the manual includes step-by-step instructions for baptisms, weddings, funerals, infant dedications, and ordinations. It also includes much-needed information regarding the training of associate ministers and other church leaders. This is a desk reference. However, wherever they are, pastors and lay leaders can download the manual on tablets, for ease of use. The manual can be used by lay leaders in every department of the Church and can be used by a variety of denominations. It introduces the ministry model and explains the Five Essentials which form the ministry's foundation. It is extremely practical, full of checklists and other tools to help pastors and other leaders understand (and explain) this way of providing congregational care. The Implementation Guide also includes a section focused on the crucial component of this ministry—the Congregational Care Minister, or CCM. This section fully describes the characteristics of CCM's, how to recruit people to this ministry, how to discern if candidates are a good fit, and how to conduct the CCM training over a multi-week period. It details the critical information CCM's must know, and the behaviors and habits they must practice in order to be effective. Note that the companion book, *The Caring Congregation Ministry: Care Minister's Manual*, is required for the CCM training. It serves as a training workbook, which then becomes the CCM's personal reference manual.
