The *Mystery of Edwin Drood* is the final novel by Charles Dickens, [1][2] originally published in 1870. Though the novel is named after the character Edwin Drood, it focuses more on Drood's uncle, John Jasper, a precentor, choirmaster and opium addict, who is in love with his pupil, Rosa Bud. Miss Bud, Edwin Drood's fiancée, has also caught the eye of the high-spirited and hot-tempered Neville Landless. Landless and Edwin Drood take an instant dislike to each other. Later Drood disappears under mysterious circumstances.

This book recounts Jack London photographer beautifully juxtaposing his worldwide famous literature with his incredible photographs.

How adequate are our theories of globalisation for analysing the worlds we share with others?
