Greece's deep recession has continued unabated, with the economy struggling to gain traction against domestic political instability and weak external conditions. Stronger internal devaluation is now under way, reflecting the interaction of labor market liberalization with the already weak labor market. Current account adjustment has accelerated, notwithstanding slow progress with structural reforms. The structural transformation of Greece's economy continues to proceed at a slow pace, and this is making Greece's adjustment more costly. Institutional reforms continued to disappoint during 2012, again complicating overall adjustment efforts.

The effective governance of education and training in the UK is the responsibility of the devolved administrations in Scotland, Wales and Northern Ireland, and is a major priority of the UK government. Many aspects of initial and continuing training are subject to continuous reform as the UK builds on its strengths and addresses challenges in the emerging systems of lifelong learning. Priorities in the UK are closely in line with the objectives of the Lisbon strategy. Vocational education and training (VET) systems in the UK tend to be complex as well as fast changing. This short review gives an overview of the main structures, trends and challenges. Vocational Education and Training in the United Kingdom

This edited book addresses a range of aspects of internationalization in vocational education and training (VET) in different countries. It

considers the impact of internationalization and student mobility on VET at the sectoral, institutional and individual levels as the sector emerges as a key tool for social and structural change in developing nations and as a flexible and entrepreneurial means of growth in developed nations. The book explores not only the effects of the neo-liberal market principle underpinning VET practices and reforms, but importantly considers internationalization as a powerful force for change in vocational education and training. As the first volume in the world that examines internationalization practices in VET, the book provides VET and international education policymakers, practitioners, researchers and educators with both conceptual knowledge and practical insights into the implementation of internationalization in VET.

This book was written to help formal and informal sector trainers provide the prospective self-employed with both useful skills and business acumen, and to help vocational training managers and administrators address the challenges of reorienting their institutions to self-employment. Self-employment is fundamentally about business, however modest the micro-enterprises of the self-employed might appear to be. The book has four principal parts. Part I opens with a brief overview of enterprise development issues, and provides a framework to help projects, training institutions and education systems consider or plan self-employment programmes. Part II is an overview of self-employment issues and options. Part III offers a collection of case studies from Africa, India, and Latin America. The final section, Part IV, offers a synthesis of experiences to date and a systematic way forward.

The position of skills development on the agenda of policy-makers and development agencies improved markedly around the turn of the 21st century. This book tracks the ways skills have gained importance both in the developing and the more industrialized world. It analyses critically the multiple 'drivers' of skills development and the linkages of skills to

the knowledge economy, growth, and employment in an increasingly competitive world. It also acknowledges the many modalities and delivery systems for skills development, arguing that this institutional diversity, often spread across several ministries and training authorities, has made it more difficult to give a national account of the skills development sector. The re-emergence of skills has triggered many reform initiatives associated with TVSD, some of which have become almost 'fashions' and are in danger of being adopted without sufficient evidence of their effectiveness. This work provides cautionary advice and fresh insights that planners will find rewarding.
