I took the liberty of publishing Jack Torrance's manuscript. The original was given to me by my uncle who worked at the Overlook Hotel in Colorado in the 70s and met Jack Torrance and his family before the tragic events we all know. I edited it, fixed it, made a few cuts, without distorting the concept. To be fair, the author should be the hotel itself, not Jack. That place has a soul of its own. Kubrick, King were very good at fictionalizing the events and Nicholson was great in The Shining. I specify that the interior is composed of a single sentence, THE MORNING HAS GOLD IN IT'S MOUTH, which repeats itself obsessively for more than 100 pages. Every now and then I pick up the original manuscript and leaf through it. It still gives me the creeps. I hope it does the same to you too.

Slowly Jack learns the pleasures of writing poetry as Miss Stretchberry encourages him to tell his own story through verse. What emerges is a moving and memorable story about a boy and his dog and his growing passion for poetry.

Famed inventor Henry "Hank" Witherspoon has gone missing, and it's up to Jack and his brilliant siblings, Ava and Matt, to find him. The kids travel deep into the Amazon jungle, following a series of clues Hank has left. Relying on genius, cunning, and new technology, the kids overcome strange creatures, a raging river, and some very clever foes to find their friend and protect his big idea. Like volumes one and two, Lost in the Jungle features a glossary of terms and an experiment kids can do at home or at school.
